

Introduction of the Three Feudal Lords

Oda Nobunaga 1534-1582

Oda Nobunaga subjugated the Owari Province (the Western part of Aichi Prefecture) and succeeded in a military expedition to Kyoto, the then-capital of Japan. He planned to unify Japan using a variety of war techniques including the large-scale use of firearms, but at the brink of unification, he was attacked by one of his vassals and ended up committing suicide.

Toyotomi Hideyoshi 1537-1598

Toyotomi Hideyoshi distinguished himself while serving as a retainer of Nobunaga. He avenged his lord Nobunaga, and succeeded in realizing his dream of unifying Japan.

Tokugawa leyasu 1542-1616

Tokugawa leyasu subjugated the Mikawa Province (the Eastern part of Aichi Prefecture) as an ally of Nobunaga. He became the central pillar of Toyotomi's government and, following Hideyoshi's death, assumed control after the Battle of Sekigahara. Soon afterwards, he was appointed Shogun and commenced the Edo Shogunate.
